The Committee reserves the right to test any exhibit for prohibited substances.

Any additional cost due to a positive result from the second sample will be charged to the exhibitor.

There will be no catalogue, as late/field entries will be accepted but the full list of entries and the results will be posted on the Wessex AHG website.

Will all those exhibitors intending to enter the Versatile Horse Competition please contact the Show Organiser to confirm their entry by 7th July as the Competition will be cancelled if there are less than SIX entries.

3. All entry forms should be fully completed and accompanied by the appropriate fees and copy registration documents, as appropriate. Incomplete entries will be returned.
4. Hard hats must be worn by mounted riders at all times. In the interests of safety, the Show Committee recommends that hard hats should conform to the standards EN1384 or PAS015 and be correctly fitted with the chinstrap properly fastened at all times when mounted.
5. Mounting blocks may be used by the ridden judges and exhibits should be prepared for this eventuality.
6. The times given in this schedule are approximate but classes will not start before the stated time. Exhibitors are responsible for being on time for their classes.
7. No horse or rider may enter the ring late, or leave the ring during a class, without obtaining permission from the Judge through the Ring Steward.
8. First and second placed exhibits, horses eligible for championships, champions and reserves will receive Championship slips in the ring and must be presented for the appropriate championships or be stripped of their placings and prizes in the class or championship concerned.
9. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without giving a reason, to amalgamate or further divide classes according to entries and to arrange for replacement judges if necessary.
10. Refund of entry fees will only be made on production of a veterinary or doctor's certificate.
11. No substitution of entries will be permitted after the closing date for entries.
12. Numbers and the final order of judging will be posted to exhibitors prior to the Show and numbers must be worn in the ring. The Entries Secretary should be contacted if numbers have not been received three days before the show date. Numbers will not be issued for entries received in the week before the show.
13. Will anyone holding trophies from The Bristol Show please return them as soon as possible.
14. In the event of the show having to be cancelled, 25% of entry fees will be retained to cover expenses.
15. Horses tied to the outside of boxes or trailers should not be left unattended.
16. Riders can be any age, unless otherwise stated.
17. Exhibitors using the services of the veterinary surgeon or farrier on call are responsible for paying for costs incurred.
18. Dogs on the showground must be on a lead, kept under control and should not be left in cars in hot weather.
19. In the interests of safety, please use the separate walkways for horses and pedestrians as signposted. No galloping is permitted outside the rings.
20. Any incident of ill treatment of any horse should be reported immediately to the Show Director.
21. No exhibit will be permitted in the collecting or show ring if there is any identifying mark or logo on its rug, tack or worn by its rider, the person showing it in hand or by any assistant or groom.

12 DRESSAGE:

Dressage classes will be run under British Dressage Rules. Times should be arranged with the Dressage Steward on the day of the Show. The Show is **NOT** affiliated for Dressage purposes.

13 NOVICE:

Novice Classes are open to horses that have not been placed first in the relevant discipline, under saddle at an AHS affiliated show before 31 December 2006. Snaffle bridles may be worn.

14 THREE GENERATIONS BRITISH BRED ARABIANS:

Class 16 is open to Pure Bred Arabians whose parents, grandparents and great grand parents must all have been bred in Britain and registered with the AHS. Please complete the special pedigree form (on the reverse of the entry form), which will be checked.

15 75% CRABBET:

Class 17: Pure Bred Arabians. A Heritage certificate (copy) produced by the Crabbet Organisation showing that the percentage of Crabbet Blood equals or exceed 75% will be required with each entry. All horses forward **MUST** be shown naturally – in the old Crabbet manner. Any unnatural posing, flicking with a whip or circling when being run out, will result in the horse being judged as though no presentation or display had been possible and therefore penalised accordingly.

16 Versatile Horse Competition:

Classes 1 and 26. Class 1 will be judged for In Hand and Ridden elements separately and combined with the results of Class 26 Dressage Test. Points will be awarded for each element and the Horse/Pony with the lowest total number of points will be the winner.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1 ENTRY FEES:

All Classes except Versatile Horse: Wessex Members £8.00, Non-members £10.00. Field entries £12.00 and £15.00 respectively. Versatile Horse £16 Wessex Members and £20 Non members (Field Entries £24 & £30 respectively).

Only fully paid up Wessex members are eligible for the reduced members' rates.

2 CLOSING DATE:

No closing date but higher fees for field entries on day of show.

3 ENTRIES:

A separate entry form must be completed for each horse. Entry Forms must be accompanied by a copy of the AHS registration papers (showing the current owner) **NOT THE PASSPORT** and if appropriate details of any leasing agreement currently lodged with the AHS. The full pedigree must be supplied for entries in the Three Generations British Bred Class. A Heritage Certificate (copy) produced by the Crabbet Organisation showing that the percentage of Crabbet Blood equals or exceeds 75% must be supplied for entries to the Crabbet Class. The correct entry fees must be enclosed with the entries. Cheques should be made payable to The Wessex Arabian Horse Group (or Wessex AHG).

4 REGISTRATION:

All exhibits must be registered, by the closing date for entries, in the appropriate stud book or register of the AHS (foals excepted) and copy registration documents including the current registered owner are requested with all entry forms, which should be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Incomplete entries will be returned. Exhibits must be registered in the ownership of the Exhibitor, or a lease must be lodged with the AHS by the closing date for entries. If you have not received your registration documents for a yearling please supply confirmation from the AHS that an application has been made.

5 FREE HORSES:

Any exhibitor whose horse breaks free in the show ring will be fined £15.00. No fee will be imposed, if another loose horse causes the infringement.

6 AHS:

The show is affiliated to The Arab Horse Society and will be subject to the current AHS rules, which are available from the AHS. AHS Rosettes will be presented Supreme and Reserve Champions.

7 CHAMPIONSHIPS:

First and second placed exhibits and champions and reserves will receive championship slips in the ring and must be presented for the appropriate championship or will be stripped of their placings and prizes in the classes or championships concerned.

8 THE BRITISH ARABIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

This show is a qualifier for the BAC to be held at Myerscough College, Myerscough Hall, St Michael's Road, Bilsborrow, Preston, Lancashire, PR3 0RY on 19th August 2007. Pure Bred ridden classes 2 – 4 & 6: The highest placed horse, previously unqualified, in the first six will qualify. Novice Purebred Ridden classes will qualify but mixed (Purebreds and Anglo/Partbred Arabs) in-hand or ridden will not. Purebred in-hand classes – Junior Gelding Class 13: The highest placed yearling, two year old and three year (one of each), previously unqualified and in the first six will qualify. Senior Gelding Class 21: The two highest placed horses, previously unqualified and in the first six will qualify. **Qualifying cards must be produced in the ring to be signed by the Judge. They may not be brought into the ring once the class has started or signed after the class has left the ring.** All details and qualifying cards from, Mrs Elaine Mann (Cards £10. payable to 'The Arab Horse Society'), 42 Wood Green, Castleford, West Yorkshire. 9 CHERIF CHAMPIONSHIP:

Class 5 is a qualifier show for the **Cherif Championship 2007**. The final will be held at the Cherif Championship Show, Addington Manor Equestrian Centre on 12th September 2007. The class may be split according to entries. **Exhibit's height must be stated on entry form.** Ponies of height 148cms and under will not be ridden by the judge but will be asked for an individual show. Two/three may qualify in the classes provided they are placed within the first four and previously unqualified. No entry placed lower than fourth can qualify. All exhibitors are issued with colour coded qualifying cards, which state the height section of the horse/pony. **Competitors must carry their qualifying cards with them in the ring to be signed by the judge. Failure to produce the card for signature means non-qualification. No cards are to be brought into the ring once the class has started.** Qualifying horses will receive a special rosette. All details and qualifying cards at £15 each (payable to 'Cherif Championship') from: Miss L Temple, Frenat, Forest Road, Pyrford, Surrey. GU22 8NA. Please state the name and accurate height of horse/pony. SAE please.

10 ROSETTES:

Rosettes will be awarded to the horses placed first to sixth. Rosettes will be presented to Champions and Reserve Champions. Details of other rosettes appear under the appropriate qualifier information. Special Rosettes will be awarded in classes where there are mixed ages or sexes to the best in the age(s) or sex(es) that have not been placed first.

11 AMATEUR STATUS:

An amateur for the purposes of this show is defined as a person who does not:- (a) engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing, or hiring horses as a means of livelihood; (b) accept remuneration for employment in connection with horses in racing, showing, livery, stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club/Riding Club excepted); (c) show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned. In addition the animal shown by the Amateur must not have been produced at any show, either in hand or under saddle, since 31 December 2004 (two thousand and four) by any person who could not be accepted as an amateur as detailed above.
